Use this list of pros and cons to help you choose a new pet for you and your family!



PROS:

- Friendly and affectionate
- Bond to owners
- Offer unconditional love and loyalty

CONS:

- Need a lot of care and attention
- Expensive over the cost of a lifetime
- May not be allowed in all homes
- Require daily exercise



PROS:

- Extremely social, smart & interactive
- Do not need to be walked outside
- No weekly grooming required
- Good pets for small spaces

ONS:

- Require specialized veterinary care
- Can be messy and loud
- Require a lot of attention (2 hrs of interaction per day, minimum!)
- Can be clingy



PROS:

- Affectionate
- Relatively easy to housetrain
- Easily adaptable

CONS:

- Don't need to be walked
- Expensive over the course of a lifetime
- Require daily interaction to keep mentally stimulated and avoid obesity



PROS:

- Hypoallergenic
- Affordable
- Don't need much space
- Relatively easy to care for

CONS.

- Certain types are aggressive or confrontational
- Require good husbandry
- Certain types may outgrow their original tanks



PROS:

- Fairly clean
- Like to live alone
- Don't smell or make much noise
- Relatively cheap and low maintenance



- They bite
- Nocturnal; most cage noise is at night so may be disruptive to sleeping children



PROS:

- Make very little noise
- Hypoallergenic
- Don't usually smell
- Most can live in small spaces

CONS

- Most need live/freshly dead insects/mice for food
- Don't bond to owners; not cuddly
- Need specialized veterinary care
- May carry bacteria (i.e. salmonella)



PROS:

- Ouiet
- Personable and bond to owners
- Can be litter box trained
- No walks
- Can live in a small space

CONS

- Require specialized veterinary care
- Should be spayed/neutered
- Be careful around children rabbits can be easily hurt



PROS:

- Great for kids: easy to handle, social and hardy
- Live in relatively small spaces
- Love people
- Clean

CONS

- Require specialized veterinary care
- Require daily interaction and exercise
- Social animals that like being with other pigs
