



Word of the Day: X-Ray

X-rays are beams that can pass through the body. When a veterinarian takes an x-ray, they are using these beams to take a picture of the inside of an animal's body. X-rays help veterinarians see an animal's bones, chest, and stomach. X-rays can help veterinarians figure out why an animal is sick or where they are hurt.

X-rays can help veterinarians assess heart disease.




Pneumonia

Pneumonia is the inflammation, or swelling, of lungs.











PreK - 2nd Grade

Build a Skeleton

Materials: black construction paper, glue, scissors, cotton swabs, crayons

- Your child can make their very own x-ray of a skeleton with just a few household items!
- Use cotton swabs as pretend "bones" and arrange them into the shape of your desired animal. Cut and glue the cotton swabs onto black construction paper to give it an x-ray image effect! You can also use a white crayon to help fill out any details.
